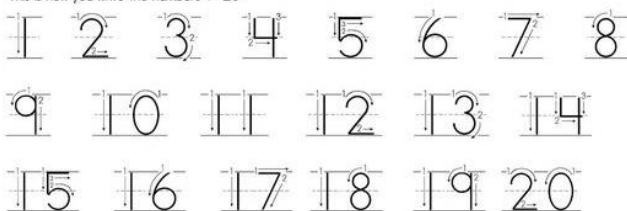

Learning Activities

Reading:

- Read all your Wall Words.
- Tell the letter sound for each letter.
- Ask an adult to read you a story.
Afterwards, you tell them the characters, setting, and what happened at the beginning, middle, and end.
- Help an adult read a story to you, but finding all of the Wall Words on each page, and any other words you can read.
- Tell an adult about the H-Brothers.
- Think of as many rhyming words for the word: CAT
- Think of as many rhyming words for the word: FOX
- Find rhyming pairs of words in your book.
- Visit Starfall.com
- Visit abcya.com and do an activity.
- Visit brainpopjr.com and watch a video.
- Visit learningchocolate.com and do an activity.

Math:

- Write numbers 0-20.
- Tell 1-more for numbers 0-20.
- Tell 1-less for numbers 1-10.
- Count to 100 by 1s.
- Count to 100 by 10s. Make groups of 10 to count using pennies, cereal, beans, or whatever mom or dad allow you to.
- Go on a coin hunt. How many pennies did you find? How many Nickels? How many dimes? How many quarters?
- Do a crayon rub of all the coins you can find.
- Look around inside and outside. What things do you see that are Triangles? Squares? Rectangles? Circles?
- Sing the Days of the Week song in a whisper, in a silly voice, in a monster voice.
- Visit abcya.com and do an activity.
- Visit brainpopjr.com and watch a video.

Science:

- Draw a picture of the weather each day.
- Predict if objects will sink or float, then check your predictions (ask an adult first)
- Look at things in nature. What patterns do you see?
- Draw a picture of how you are using each of your 5 senses: seeing, touch
- Draw a picture of how you looked as a baby, how you look now, and how you think you will change to look in the future.
- Go on a magnet hunt. Where do you find magnets in your house?
- Visit brainpopjr.com and watch a video.
- Visit learningchocolate.com and do a activity.

Social Studies:

- Draw a picture of how you are being a good citizen at home.
- Look at your neighborhood. Draw some things that are part of your community.
- Tell someone about how George Washington helped our country.
- Tell someone about how Martin Luther King, Jr. helped our country.
- Think of all the different ways people can get from 1 place to another and draw them.
- Visit brainpopjr.com and watch a video.
- Visit learningchocolate.com and do an activity.
- Ask an adult how things were different when they were growing up in the past.
- Draw a map of your room or house.

Writing:

- Write your first and last name.
- Practice writing upper case letters.
- Practice writing lower case letters.
- Writer's Workshop: each day, for 10-15 minutes, illustrate and Write about whatever you want.
- Tell how you are showing Win-Win behavior at home
